Chungnam National University Daejeon, Republic of Korea (South Korea)

Chungnam National University (CNU) is one of the most prestigious national universities in the nation. Since the establishment in May, 1952, CNU has played as a national leading role in educating talented youth and has participated in the local and national

Daejeon is South Korea's fifth largest metropolis with 1.5 million population. Korea Advanced Institute of Science and Technology and Chungnam National University. Daejeon has earned its name as 'Asia's Silicon Valley' and 'High Technology City,' as it has a number of R&D institutes in cooperation with CNU.

SECTION 03

International Exchange Programs

01

Exchange Program

Students from partner institutions with exchange agreement can study at CNU for at a semester or a year with tuition fees waived. Depending on agreements, there may be other benefits such as accommodation fee exemption or free Intensive Korean Language course.

02

Global Scholarship Program (GSP)

Same as the exchange program, one difference is that GSP students receive full scholarships for tuition and accommodation fees with one-time stipend of 500,000–1,000,000 KRW.

03

Summer Session for International Students (SSIS)

SSIS is a short term program for students having interests in attending academic courses and experiencing Korean culture throughout 7 weeks in summer. Successfully admitted students will be offered scholarships for tuition and accommodation fees and full support for diverse field trips and cultural activities.

04

Visiting Student Program

Students are able to study for a semester or a year and have to pay for all costs such as tuition, accommodation and others that may be occurred.

05

Dual Degree Program

Students can be granted double degrees from CNU and their home institution after studying at both institutions for 2 years respectively.

International Admission

Students must have a high school diploma or an equivalent qualification for the undergraduate, a bachelor's degree or an equivalent qualification for the graduate program, and a master's degree or an equivalent qualification for the doctoral degree.



1. Application
2. TOPIK (Test of Proficiency in Korean) Level 3 or above
3. Minimum accepted scores from recognized English proficiency tests are : TOEIC 650, TOEFL (PBT 550, CBT 210, iBT 80), TEPS 550, IELTS 5.5
4. Level 3 or higher on a Test of Korean Proficiency supervised by the CNU Language Education Center
5. Completion of level 4 or higher in a Korean Language course at the CNU Language Education Center
6. Interview is required for undergraduate applicants.

SECTION 04

CNU Korean Language Education Program

Korean Language Course at CNU is designed for international students to be admitted to Korean universities including Chungnam National University. The students will be offered not only the Korean language but also its traditional/modern culture. More than 2,000 international students attend CNU International Language Education Center every year.

Korean Language Education Center is designated by NIIED Korean Government Scholarship Program. In addition CNU Korean Language Education Center has the highest number of students among national universities, around 2,200 international students every year.

Course schedule

Morning class (09:00 – 12:50), afternoon class (13:30 – 17:20)

Course Level

Level	Objectives & Content	Hours
Basic	1 Beginners with no knowledge of Korean language will learn the principles of Korean vowels, consonants and pronunciation.	10 weeks (200 hours)
	2 Learners are expected to communicate in day-to-day simple Korean and will be able to communicate on their own in public settings such as post offices, banks and markets.	10 weeks (200 hours)
Intermediate	3 Learners are expected to express themselves mostly in Korean.	10 weeks (200 hours)
	4 Basic social issues in Korea will be learned and understood, and they will gain skills/abilities to communicate in both work settings and university level class settings.	10 weeks (200 hours)
Advanced	5 Learners are expected to understand general social conditions of Korea and express themselves in Korean.	10 weeks (200 hours)
	6 Learners are expected to speak Korean freely and have no problem watching and listening to Korean movies, drama and news.	10 weeks (200 hours)
	7 Learners will be capable of making moving picture in Korean.	10 weeks (200 hours)
	8 They will be capable of communicating with professors and other Koreans	10 weeks (200 hours)

Costs

- Application fee: 60,000 KRW (non-refundable)
- Tuition: 1,300,000 KRW
- Insurance: 150,000 KRW for a year
(All newly-admitted students must purchase their insurance, and the cost is subject to change each year.)



SECTION 05

Dormitory



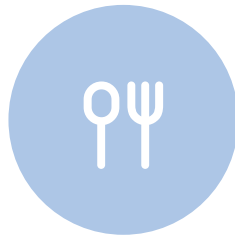
CNU dormitory can accommodate around 5,000 students. Rooms are furnished with a bed, desk, chair, closet and book shelf. You need to bring or purchase your own beddings such as a pillow and blankets. Personal bathing items are not provided. Room type: a single, double-shared, triple-shared. For shared rooms, costs range from 450,000 KRW to 550,000 KRW for a semester. This does not include any meal plan. Estimated fees may slightly increase every year. Facilities: Gym, laundry room, cafeteria, stationer, convenience store, dining hall, coffee shop and others.

Dormitory schedule

- Spring: March to Mid-June
- Summer 1: Mid-June to mid-July
- Summer 2: Mid-July to mid-August
- Fall: September to mid-December
- Winter 1: Mid-December to mid-January
- Winter 2: Mid-January to mid-February



*All students must pay the fees for either the summer or winter terms even if their fees for spring or fall are waived as part of their participating program.



Meal Plan

- Type 1: Two meals from Mon-Fri, no meal on weekends
- Type 2: Two meals from Mon-Fri, two meals on weekends
- Type 3: Two meals from Mon-Fri, four meals on weekends
- Type 4: Two meals from Mon-Fri, six meals on weekends

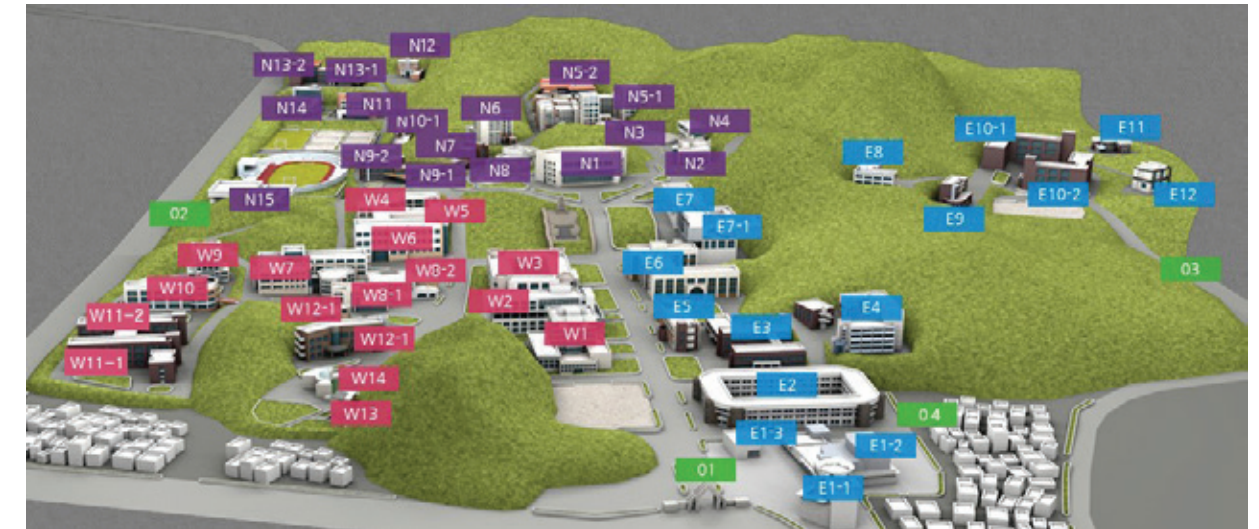
